Update from Dr. Carlomagno / Return to School Planning

Dear Parents,

Our Core Return to School Team (CRST) has met twice this week and we are defining guiding principles, reviewing team assignments, and looking at possible draft schedules for returning to school in the fall. Additionally, we sent a survey to staff asking for their thinking and input on possible student schedules for our start of school. As shared via last week's video message, the CRST has site principals, district level staff, trustees, parents and educators, and facilitator Lynn Wendell as members. It is a smaller group that plans on meeting two times a week through June and early July.

As a reminder, the four pillars from the Pandemic Recovery Framework for schools from the San Mateo County Office of Education is being used as the foundation for our work. These four pillars include *Health and Hygiene, Face Coverings, Physical Distancing,* and *Limit Gathering*. My hope is that this document will be made public on Monday, June 8th. I know the county is working diligently on this document but is not quite ready to release it to the public.

In addition, we have a Return to School Advisory Committee (RSAC). We have 15 parents on this team and 32 educators It's a big group and that's a good thing! We are looking for input from our stakeholders and we look forward to hearing their thinking and perspectives. RASC members will meet during the week of June 15th. The agenda for our first RSAC will include an update from the Core Return to School Team (CRST) on guiding principals for our work and possible draft schedules.

Additionally, I am looking at dates to hold meetings for any interested parent to share their ideas and thinking on returning to school in the fall. These meetings will likely take place during the week of June 15th. Please stay tuned for dates and times.

Drive-thru, Drop-off and Pick-up!

On Tuesday, June 9th and Wednesday, June 10th, each school site will be collecting school materials and returning student items. The drivethru drop off/pick up will occur in the front of each school and has been designed to be contactless to ensure the safety of staff and families.



Please be aware that staff will be wearing face coverings and will be strictly following social distancing guidelines. Additionally, all returned items from families will be quarantined for a week.

Please refer to the email that was sent home earlier this week from principals with the school specific drop off/pick up times and procedures parents will be asked to follow.

All schools will be asking families to place items that are to be returned to school within a cardboard box or laundry basket that will be placed in the trunk or back of an SUV. The use of the cardboard box or laundry basket will allow staff to easily identify and collect the items to be returned. Please begin gathering materials to be returned and reviewing your child's school specific procedures.

The Last Week of School Activities and Resources!

Should you want to provide your students with some activities for the upcoming final calendar week of school commencing on June 8th, 2020, a group of HCSD educators has worked to curate a few resources for you.

- For students in Kindergarten 2nd grade and students in 3rd -5th grade, we've put together five (Monday-Friday) daily learning plans with nine activities tied to the Essential Outcomes each day. The degree of parent involvement varies but there was an effort to align activities on some days so families with students in both grade-level bands can do activities together. If you'd like to create your own daily plans, you can use the provided template (the link below will force a copy) and adjust as you'd like.
- For middle school, we've put together a few resources that house numerous activities. As our older students tend to be more self-directed and independent, we've not included a specific daily plan. If one is needed, we'd recommend you use the Crocker student schedule that was used during distance learning as a base and encourage students to fill in the learning that makes sense for them.

As always, modify these schedules and activities as needed. This is a great time for students to take a lot of control over how they'll use their time. I hope you find these resources helpful and that your student(s) enjoy this last, and very unique, week of the 2019-2020 school year!
